Fourth Session of the FAO Panel of Experts on Pesticide Management and Second Session of the FAO/WHO Joint Meeting on Pesticide Management – Geneva, Switzerland, 6-8 October 2008

The Second FAO/WHO Joint Meeting on Pesticide Management and 4th Session of the FAO Panel of Experts on Pesticide Management took place at WHO Headquarters in Geneva, from 6 to 8 October 2008. The Meeting discussed risk reduction from highly hazardous pesticides, and slightly modified the earlier established criteria for the identification of highly hazardous pesticides. The Meeting further recommended that FAO and WHO develop a programme to strengthen the implementation of the Code of Conduct, in particular in developing countries. Specific suggestions for elements of such a programme were made, among them an increased focus on national implementation. Various draft guidelines were discussed, including ones on pesticide registration, pesticide advertising, and reporting health and environmental incidents resulting from

exposure to pesticides. The meeting also noted the need to explicitly address all pesticides when implementing the Code of Conduct, including agricultural, public health and domestic products.

Joint Meeting of the FAO Panel of Experts on Pesticide Residues in Food and the Environment and the WHO Core Assessment Group on Pesticide Residues (JMPR) – Rome, Italy, 9-18 September 2008

The 2008 JMPR was held in Rome, Italy, from 9 to 18 September 2008. The FAO Panel of Experts had met in Preparatory Sessions from 4 to 8 September. Almost 30 pesticides were evaluated. Furthermore, general issues, such as achieving globally harmonized MRLs through Codex, residue combination in the estimation of MRLs and STMRs etc., were addressed. In cooperation with WHO, FAO will hold the 8th FAO/WHO JMPS in San Salvador, El Salvador, from 3 to 11 June 2009. The 2009 programme for the development of FAO and WHO specifications for pesticides is now available on the web.
