 - Regulators
 - Affected stakeholders







Examples from the Near East and North African (NENA) region:


- Regional challenges (available in EN, AR, FR)

- Soil pollution in the NENA countries (under review)
- Soil fertility and implementation of sustainable soil management (SSM) to boost soil productivity (under review)
- Best practices to prevent soil erosion (including water harvesting) (under review)
- Conservation agriculture and carbon sequestration (under review)
- Soil sealing and soil crusting (in the 2022 NENA Soil Partnership work plan)








Example from Asia
