DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the overall guidance of the Director, FIR, the general supervision of the Branch Chief, Fishing Operations and Technology (FIRO) and the direct supervision of the Fishery Industry Officer (Vessels), and in close cooperation with members of relevant teams established within the Department and the Organization, the incumbent will provide technical support to and participate in the implementation of work programmes and development of policies related to the enhancement of monitoring, control and surveillance (MCS) technologies and operations. In particular, the incumbent will:

- review and provide technical support of off-the-shelf technologies for vessel monitoring/electronic observer/reporting systems;
- review remote sensing applications for use in capture fisheries;
- prepare technical studies of GIS mapping of bycatch interactions with fishing operations;
- undertake background research and/or provide technical inputs as appropriate for preparation of guidelines, publications and awareness raising materials on MCS and IUU fishing;
- perform other related duties as required.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Candidates should meet the following:

- Advanced university degree in engineering, fisheries or marine environment or related fields
- One year of relevant experience in fisheries or the marine environment
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and limited knowledge of one of the other two or Arabic, Chinese or Russian.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Candidates will be assessed against the following:

- Relevance of experience in fisheries or the marine environment, including the level of familiarity with GIS, remote sensing, satellite communications technologies or app development
- Ability to plan and organize own work, deliver results and meet deadlines
- Ability to work effectively within a team, supporting others, and fostering a positive team environment
- Commitment to continual improvement of knowledge, skills and abilities
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
