HLPE: An innovation at the heart of the reformed CFS



- 1. Political role for civil society... Inclusiveness
- 1. HLPE: Institutionalization of independent evidencebased reports to inform policy debate of CFS and explore controversies

Taken from the Reform document CFS

"This effort should help create synergies between world class academic/scientific knowledge, field experience, knowledge from

social actors and practical application in various settings."

The CFS invites the HLPE to:



- (i) Assess and analyze the current state of food security and nutrition and its underlying causes.
- (ii) Provide scientific and knowledge-based analysis and advice on specific policy-relevant issues, utilizing existing high quality research, data and technical studies.
- (iii) Identify emerging issues, and help members prioritize future actions and attentions on key focal areas.

Key attributes of the HLPE



- Created, appointed, mandated by the CFS but works independently
- Addresses the complexity of food security and nutrition through multidisciplinary approach
- Works in a transparent and open way; in particular, the HLPE is open to different kinds of knowledge

"One of the key roles of the reports is to help members and participants in CFS to understand why they disagree" (MS Swaminathan, 1st HLPE Chair)

Critical and Emerging Issues



In 2013, CFS requested the HLPE to produce a note on *Critical and emerging issues* (C&EI) for food security and nutrition that:

- Provided insights
- Used an evidence-based perspective
- Built on the knowledge of diverse actors

Results of the inquiry 2014



- Invited Participants from knowledge organizations, institutions and knowledge networks: 90 issues from 25 sources (out of 77 invited)
- Open consultation: 42 issues (from 28 different sources)
- Each contribution came as a response to a detailed questionnaire

Total: 132 issues (590 pages) from 53 different contributors

Criteria and process



HLPE Steering Committee then:

- Synthesised results of inquiry
- Mapped C&E issues around thematic clusters
- Created a short list of issues
- criteria include:
 - Impact on FSN (including women, vulnerable groups)
 - Depth and breadth of the issue
 - Urgency and emerging character of the issue
 - Gap in knowledge and understanding
 - Explore controversies

Healthy nutrition in changing food systems (Triple Burden; sustainability)

Livestock systems and FSN: challenges and opportunities

Inequalities and FSN (resources, access food, governance): the imperative of addressing the needs of disadvantaged and vulnerable populations

The increasing role of financial markets in FSN (land, products, services, non agricultural commodities, financial products

Pathways to sustainable food systems: the pursuit of human and environmental health for all

2 August 2016: CFS request to produce a new HLPE note on Critical and emerging issues... next MYPOW

6 August – 2 December 2016: Open Inquiry

January – May 2017: Draft, peer review & finalization of the HLPE note

September: release of the final note in all the UN languages

The inclusive process itself becomes a critical outcome




