Background	This First Plenary session will set the context for the Conference by taking stock of the progress in tackling disaster and climate risks facing food and agriculture systems in Asia and the Pacific. Unpacking past disaster damage and loss, the panel will deliberate on the nature of evolving risks to food and agriculture in the region. These risks are driven by changing hazard characteristics and their geographical patterns, rapid urbanization, globally connected economies and market forces, transforming consumption / demand patterns, as well as changing priorities of rural youth and producer families, and national policies underpinned by global and regional agreements. On-going efforts of the agriculture sectors to reduce risk and strengthen resilience will

	be shared as well as challenges and emerging learnings, setting the scene for further deliberations and identification of required actions at policy, programmatic and community/farm levels across agricultural sub-sectors (viz. agriculture, livestock / pastoral / animal husbandry, fisheries, aquaculture, land, water, and forest). The role of the agriculture sectors in achieving resilience related SDGs, implementation of the Sendai Framework for DRR (SFDRR) and the Paris Agreement will be highlighted, given that the sector is the most relevant to demonstrate coherence in implementing these interlinked frameworks.
Session objectives	 The session aims to: Share findings of the FAO Global Report on Agricultural Disaster Damage and Loss as the basis for a better understanding of risks and vulnerabilities facing food and agriculture.
