




- 120 million full-time + part-time workers in capture fisheries
- 97% in developing countries
- 90% work in small-scale fisheries –
 largest group of ocean users
- Inland fisheries 60 million people

Fisheries Livelihoods





- Sub-Saharan Africa, Asia's mega-deltas + Pacific SIDS -SSF food & livelihoods for decades
- High # jobs + revenue –
 sustainable management of stocks, evaluate trade-offs
- High # jobs protect SSF access,
 support SSF enterprises




