REPORT ON CONTACTS MADE BY THE INTERIM SECRETARIAT WITH RELEVANT ORGANISATIONS, IN ORDER TO PROMOTE THE FUNDING STRATEGY

REQUEST FROM THE OPEN-ENDED WORKING GROUP ON THE RULES OF PROCEDURE AND THE FINANCIAL RULES OF THE GOVERNING BODY, COMPLIANCE AND THE FUNDING STRATEGY, AND ACTION TAKEN

- 1. At its meeting in Rome on 14 to 17 December 2005, the *Open-ended Working Group on the Rules of Procedure and the Financial Rules of the Governing Body, Compliance and the Funding Strategy* requested the Interim Secretariat to "establish contact with relevant organizations in order to promote the Funding Strategy, and to invite such organizations to participate in the first session of the Governing Body." ¹
- 2. As requested by the Open-ended Working Group, the Secretariat of the Interim Committee established contact with relevant organisations to promote the Funding Strategy on 15 May 2006, and those organisations that are in consultative status with FAO were invited to participate in the first session of the Governing Body.
- 3. The information note issued to the relevant organisations is attached as *Appendix 1* to this document.
- 4. *Appendix 2* lists the organizations to which the information note was addressed. The Organisations to which this note was sent are as listed below.
- 5. The information provided in this note is for the Governing Body to take into account, as it sees fit, in the context of draft agenda item 7, *Adoption of the Funding Strategy for the Implementation of the Treaty*.

COMMUNICATION TO ORGANIZATIONS RELEVANT TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FUNDING STRATEGY OF THE INTERNATIONAL TREATY ON PLANT GENETIC RESOURCES FOR FOOD AND AGRICULTURE

INFORMATION NOTE

Rome, 15 May 2006

The International Treaty on Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture (http://www.fao.org/ag/cgrfa/itpgr.htm) was adopted by the FAO Conference on 3 November 2001 and entered into force on 29 June 2004. The First Session of the Governing Body of the International Treaty will take place in Madrid, Spain on 12 to 16 June 2006.

The objectives of the International Treaty are "the conservation and sustainable use of plant genetic resources for food and agriculture and the fair and equitable sharing of the benefits arising out of their use, in harmony with the Convention on Biological Diversity, for sustainable agriculture and food security". In order to achieve those objectives, the International Treaty contains provisions on:

- The conservation, exploration, collection, characterization, evaluation and documentation of plant genetic resources for food and agriculture (Article 5);
- Sustainable use of plant genetic resources (Article 6);
- National commitments and international cooperation (Article 7);
- Technical assistance (Article 8);
- Farmers' Rights (Article 9);
- A Multilateral System of Access and Benefit-sharing (Articles 10 to 13);
- A number of supporting components, including on the Global Plan of Action, *ex situ* collections of the plant genetic resources for food and agriculture held by the International Agricultural Research Centres of the Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research, international plant genetic resources networks and the global information system on plant genetic resources for food and agriculture (Articles 14 to 17); and
- A Funding Strategy (Article 18).

At its first meeting, held in Rome on 14 to 17 December 2005, the Open-ended Working Group on the Rules of Procedure and the Financial Rules of the Governing Body, Compliance and the Funding Strategy requested the Interim Secretariat to "establish contact with relevant organizations in order to promote the Funding Strategy, and to invite such organizations to participate in the first session of the Governing Body."³

The objectives of the Funding Strategy are "to enhance the availability, transparency, efficiency and effectiveness of the provision of financial resources to implement activities under this Treaty." Article 18 of the International Treaty identifies a number of potential sources of financial resources for the Funding Strategy, including:

a. Financial resources provided by developed country Contracting Parties, which Contracting Parties that are developing countries or countries with economies in transition avail themselves of.⁵

b. Financial resources for priority activities, plans and programmes relevant to the implementation of the Treaty provided by relevant international mechanisms, funds and bodies⁶ and through bilateral and multilateral channels.⁷

- c. Financial resources for national activities for the conservation and sustainable use of plant genetic resources for food and agriculture.8
- d. Financial resources resulting from the sharing of monetary benefits from the commercialization of plant genetic resources for food and agriculture under Article 13.2d(ii) of the Treaty.9
- e. Voluntary contributions from Contracting Parties; the private sector, including the food processing industries; non-governmental organizations; and other sources.¹⁰

The Funding Strategy is further analyzed in document "Development of the Funding Strategy for the International Treaty on Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture", which was prepared for the first meeting of the Open-ended Working Group, a copy of which is attached for your information.

In line with the request from the Open-ended Working Group, organizations may wish to participate, as observers, in the First Session of the Governing Body of the International Treaty. In this case they are requested to inform the Secretary at the address given below.

Organizations are also invited to make written representations regarding the Funding Strategy of the International Treaty and any role that they might play in its realization, which might be made available to the First Session of the Governing Body. Any written representations should be sent to the Secretary no latter than 31 May 2006.¹¹
