The International Conference on Forests for Food Security and Nutrition was organized by FAO in partnership with Bioversity International, the Center for International Forestry Research, the World Agroforestry Centre and the World Bank and held at FAO headquarters on 13–15 May 2013. This technical meeting was attended by more than 400 participants, comprising experts from
