	 Appreciate the document informing on progress in implementing the MYPOW 2020-2023 covering the full period between COFO 26 and COFO 27 and in addition presenting the Committee's approach and working method to achieve its objective in 2024-2027.
	 Commend the work done on a wide range of issues with regard to implementation of MYPOW 2020- 2023 and detailed description of intersessional activities of the COFO Secretariat and the COFO Steering Committee.
	 Acknowledge in particular the progress on the linkages between forestry and agriculture and the collaboration between COFO and COAG and support further collaboration in the future.
	 Support the consultations with RFCs, which are indispensable for cross-sectorial work, and encourage deepening those consultations.
	• Adopt the MYPOW 2024-2027 and support the increase of the efficiency of the work of the Committee to address the pressing challenges facing our forests and the urgent need for coordinated action.
	 Recommend inserting, along with planned activities, an indication of measurable result or output, which will allow the members of the Committee to more easily review the achievements and appreciate and evaluate the implementation of the planned measure.
Japan Friday, 28 June 2024 11:11 (CET)	Japan welcomes FAO's continued efforts on the forestry and agriculture linkages and collaboration with COAG. Given the urgency of decoupling agricultural commodities production from deforestation and biodiversity loss, we expect that further expansion of actions in collaboration with the agricultural sector will be discussed in depth under Agenda 5.
	Japan provides funding for FAO's BiG-CHANCE project, which is working to develop tools that are useful for policymakers and producers in preventing deforestation through the establishment of sustainable agricultural supply chains. We appreciate the cross-departmental collaboration within FAO to develop and disseminate these tools.

	Japan appreciates the inputs from COFO to the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development towards achieving the SDGs which include the key message regarding sustainable use of forest resources along with forest conservation and restoration. 	Recognition of the role of forests in post-pandemic recovery and their contribution to economic sustainability;
	Promotion of sustainable forestry practices has supported the resilience of local economies;
