Foreign exchange

10. The local currency in Guyana is the Guyana Dollar. Major credit cards are accepted by most hotel, restaurants, supermarkets, car rental agencies and tour operators. Credit cards with CIRRUS and/or PLUS mark can be used at any Scotia Bank ATM machines.

Field trip

11. On Thursday, 12 September there will be a field visit. It is recommended that participants wear jeans and t-shirts, sneakers and headwear.

General information about the country

- 12. **Guyana**, officially the Cooperative Republic of Guyana, is a sovereign state on the northern coast of South America that is culturally part of the Anglophone Caribbean. Guyana is the only state of the Commonwealth of Nations on mainland South America, and the only one on the continent where English is the official language. Guyana is member of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM), which has its secretariat headquarters in Guyana's capital, Georgetown. Guyana is divided into three countries (Essequibo, Demerara and Berbice) and has four geographical regions: the interior savannahs, the highland region, the hilly sand and clay area and the low coastal plain. It is bordered to the east by Suriname, to the south and southwest by Brazil, to the west by Venezuela, and on the north by the Atlantic Ocean.
- 13. **Georgetown**, the capital and largest city of Guyana, is located on the Atlantic Ocean coast at the mouth of the Demerara River and it was nicknamed Garden City of the Caribbean. The city serves primarily as economic and administrative centre. The striking wooden architecture is reminiscent of Guyana's centuries as a Dutch, and then as a British colony. The St. George's Cathedral is reputed to be the tallest wooden building in the world. The terrain in this part of the country is flat coastal plains. The city is surrounded by a blanket of cane fields along with marshy swamps, and savannah lands on its east and south.

Climate

14. Georgetown has a year-round hot tropical rainforest climate. For the month of September the average daily temperature fluctuates between a minimum of 16°C and a maximum of 31°C.

Electricity

15. Electric power in Georgetown is 110v and 220v in most other places, including parts of suburban Georgetown.
