

APPENDIX C: Details of Donor support funding

A. Current Programmes

The CRMP (2000-2007) is funded by ADB, and the governments of the Netherlands and Sri Lanka (US\$80m). The project has four major components:

- (a) coastal stabilisation – to address the problem of coastal erosion by construction of coast stabilisation structures and development of proactive or preventative erosion management schemes
- (b) Fisheries Resource management and quality improvement – to achieve sustainable coastal fishery resource management supported by the construction of fisheries harbours, anchorages and ancillary facilities that allow the improvement of fish quality and the reduction of handling losses
- (c) Coastal Environmental Resources Management – to address the problem of coastal resource depletion and degradation, and promote activities that will reduce pollution in lagoons and estuaries and relieve pressure on coastal resources
- (d) Institutional strengthening – to enhance the institutional strengthening capabilities of MFAR and its agencies, including CCD.

ARDQIP (2003-2009) is funded by ADB, the Government of Sri Lanka and the National Development Trust Fund (US\$30m). Project interventions will encourage community-based and private-sector-led development of perennial and seasonal tank sub-sector. The focus of the Project will be to develop and demonstrate models that can be easily replicated by community-based organizations and by private entrepreneurs. With this in view, the project design, centres around the development of small-scale, low cost infrastructure at the community level, and supporting entrepreneurship development by providing access to (i) technology, (ii) technical expertise, (iii) information systems, (iv) credit, and (v) extension services. Through institutional strengthening activities, the project will assist the National Aquaculture Development Authority (NAQDA) to build its technical and financial capacity to support these developments, and to become a financially self-sustaining organization.

IFAD (2007-:2011): The Project (US\$39m) is to support the re-establishment and enhancement of social and economic conditions in tsunami affected areas with an emphasis on poverty reduction and gender positive development issues. The components comprise:

- (i) Community based coastal resource management;
- (ii) Support to artisanal fisheries development
- (iii) Post harvest and marketing
- (iv) Micro enterprise and financial services
- (v) Social & economic infrastructure.
