What is Shared Stewardship in the United States? A Discussion with National and State Leaders

Expanding partnerships and working at larger scales are at the heart of the US Department of Agriculture Forest Service strategy for the future. We call this approach Shared Stewardship, and it emphasizes engaging our partners across land ownerships and all levels of government in shared decision making and priority setting to do the right work, in the right place, and at the right scale. We continue to strengthen key partnerships and are currently in the process of establishing Shared Stewardship agreements with individual US states. In the coming decade, these agreements will underpin our shared priority setting and leverage our combined capacity to improve forest conditions. Such engagement is critical for successful and sustainable implementation of restoration. US Forest Service Associate Chief Angela Coleman and Nevada State Forester Firewarden Kacey KC will share experiences with developing shared stewardship agreements between national and state-level agencies and their impact on US forest landscape restoration, wildfire management, and biodiversity conservation efforts.
