CONTEXT

The project, "Implementation of the Forest and Landscape Restoration Mechanism (FLRM)" was established in November 2014 with the financial support of the Korea Forest Service (KFS) of the Republic of Korea. This project aimed to create a Mechanism that could play a leading role in forest and landscape restoration (FLR) at global, regional and national levels. In the first phase of the project, the FLRM mobilized financial resources for over USD 40 million to scale-up restoration activities in 20 countries in several regions (Africa, Mediterranean and Asia-Pacific). As the first phase of the project came to an end in 2020 with excellent achievements for building a solid foundation of the FLRM as a sustainable mechanism, KFS approved its financial extension to 2025. The main objective of the second-phase project is to stabilize the settlement of the FLRM and implement FLR at a large scale under the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration (2021-2030).

This session will be the occasion to present and discuss a few key achievements of the project in several targeted countries. Each country will give an overview of past or currently implemented activities and future perspectives. The session will close by presenting knowledge products developed with the key support of KFS and by the official presentation of the Korean version of the forestry journal Unasylva 252: Restoring the Earth – The next decade.
