Strengthening Food Security and Nutrition Statistics:

Towards a new domain under the umbrella of the Statistical Commission

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The CFS recommendations are divided in <u>five areas</u> addressing different challenges:

1. CREATE GREATER AWARENESS AND DEMAND FOR BETTER USE OF FSN DATA IN DECISION-MAKING

- Establish multisectoral and multistakeholder FSN mechanisms (1a)
- Promote dialogues and cooperation (1b)
- Promote the regular production and dissemination of evidencebased FSN knowledge products (1e)
- Develop guidelines on datainformed policy evaluation (1g)
- Use existing data (1c/i/j) and promote interoperability (1j)

2. INCREASE AND OPTIMIZE INVESTMENT IN THE COLLECTION, ANALYSIS AND ENHANCEMENT OF FSN DATA

- Increase, sustain and coordinate investment on FSN data (2a/f/g)
- Build on existing FSN data funding initiatives (2h)
- Elaborate national plans to define priorities, integrated in the NSDS (2b)
- Outline a minimum set of core FSN data to help countries identify priorities when collecting FSN data (2d)
- Identify data gaps and needs and accelerate innovation (2e)

3. DEVELOP CAPACITIES, INFRASTRUCTURE AND TECHNOLOGIES

- Invest in building the capacities of statisticians, data experts and social scientists (3a)
- Modernize infrastructures (3b/c)
- Expand training opportunities (3d/e/f)
- Invest in innovation and cost-saving approaches (3g/i)
- Prioritize capacity development for greater impact (3h)
- Reduce language barriers (3k)

4. COLLABORATION ON HARMONIZATION AND SHARING OF FSN DATA

- Promote harmonization, coherence and interoperability of FSN data and platforms (4a)
- Consider FSN statistics as a domain in the UNSC (4b)
- Treat FSN data as open as possible but as closed as necessary to serve the public good (4d)
- Promote the use and integration of FSN data from various sources (4e)
- Increase collaboration on data access/sharing (4f)
- Promote compliance with open-access and fair use principles (4h)

5. STRENGTHEN FSN DATA GOVERNANCE FRAMEWORKS

- Include FSN data within a broader national data governance (5a)
- Discuss the development of FSN data principles (5c)
- Non-state actors are encouraged to share FSN data and analytics for the public good (5d)

Implications (and opportunities) of the CFS recommendations for the Statistical Commission

1) Creation of a **new data domain on food security and nutrition statistics** under the aegis of the UNSC

- ✓ Forum for discussions on concepts and methodologies for measuring food security and nutrition and the underlying data sources.
- ✓ Forum to standardize methodologies and harmonize available data
- ✓ Forum to promote the production and use of food security and nutrition statistics
- \checkmark Regular reports on the state and progress to the UNSC

Endorse the new statistical domain at the 55th session of the UNSC (agenda item 3i)
Invite FAO, UNICEF and WHO to report to the UNSC on the state and progress made in this statistical domain (every two years)

Implications (and opportunities) of the CFS recommendations for the Statistical Commission

2) Establish a UN Committee of experts on food security and nutrition statistics

✓ The programme of work of this Committee will constitute the basis for development in the area of FSN statistics and the reporting to the UNSC

→ Agreement of the UN-CEAG to take on this responsibility for now (in its meeting of February 20th 2024) until a new group is approved

Implications (and opportunities) of the CFS recommendations for the Statistical Commission

3) In the short term (next 2 years), establish **two lines of work identified as priority for the CFS** under the aegis of this Committee:

- ✓ Definition of food security and nutrition data
- ✓ Development of guidelines which will include:
 - ✓ The definition of a minimum set of core data for assessing the state of FSN
 - ✓ References to **recommended indicators, methodologies and data sources**
 - ✓ Guidance to help countries prioritize the collection of relevant FSN data

→ Endorse the UN-CEAG work programme 2024-27 at the 55th session of the UNSC (agenda item 3i)

Implications (and opportunities) of the CFS recommendations for the Statistical Commission

4) Organize and support the work of the task force of the UN-CEAG on food security and nutrition statistics

Review of the proposed core set of FSN indicators (UN-CEAG task force)	Q2-Q3 2024
Draft guidelines (first draft)	Q3 2024
Validation meeting (UN-CEAG task force)	Q3-Q4 2024
Finalization of the guidelines, including editorial review and layout	Q4 2024
Presentation of guidelines to UNSC for discussion/endorsement	Q1 2025
Publication of guidelines	Q1 2025
Advocacy, outreach and training	From Q2 2025
