Committee on Contaminants in foods (CCCF9)

Nigeria supports the proposed sampling plans and performance criteria for method of analysis for feminism (FB1+FB20) in maize grain, maize flour and maize meal and also the sampling plans for DON in cereal based foods for infants and young children, in flour, meal, semolina and flakes derived from wheat, maize or barley and in raw cereal grains (wheat, maize and barley) including sampling plans for raw cereal grains.

Nigeria commends the work of E-Working Group led by Brazil and Japan. Nigeria will join CCMAS in the continuation of discussion in consideration of review and update in CODEX STAN 234-1999. Principally most of the methods are obsolete not feasible and because of current health implications of the reagents.
