e. Structure

EPA is an association of 6 companies, who produce more than 90 % of all polyols manufactured in the EU. The EPA secretariat is a permanent secretariat that is established in Brussels: the secretariat regularly informs the members about EU and international regulatory affairs affecting polyols (numeroted circular letters), and convenes meetings where members have the opportunity to discuss scientific, technical and regulatory issues of importance for polyols.

f. Indication of funding

The funding comes exclusively from membership contributions.

g. Meetings

EPA members have at minimum two technical meetings a year and one Annual General Meeting, all well attended by one or several representatives of the member companies (please see also the by-laws).

h. Relations with other international organizations

None.

i. Expected contribution to the Joint FAO/WHO Food Standards Programme

EPA intends to contribute to the Joint FAO/WHO Food Standards Programme mainly through the work of the Codex Alimentarius Commission, and in particular of the Codex Committee on Food Additives (CCFA), the Codex Committee on Food Labelling (CCFL) and the Codex Committee on Nutrition and Foods for Special Dietary Uses (CCNFSDU).

Actually, EPA has an in-depth scientific and technical expertise on polyols used in foods. Polyols represent a category of 9 food additives¹ that have many technological functions (bulk sweetener, bulking agent, flavour enhancer, humectant, stabiliser, sequestrant, or thickener). All polyols are assigned an ADI not specified. At international level, polyols are included in the Table III of the GSFA "Additives permitted for use in food in general, unless otherwise specified, in accordance with GMP". Due to their low calorific value and their non-cariogenic properties, polyols are often used to produce healthier alternatives to many traditional recipes without compromising on taste or quality.

The participation of EPA is requested in the work of the Codex Alimentarius Commission in particular related to:
