#### SURVEY ON THE COMPUTER-RELATED NEEDS OF THE REGION

#### **BACKGROUND**

- 1. At the 13<sup>th</sup> Session of the CCLAC, it became clear that one of the central problems of the region was the lack of communication
- 2. The Strategic Plan for the Region adopted at the 13<sup>th</sup> Session of the CCLAC set the aim of **improving communication among CCLAC Members**.
- 3. Considering the dynamics of Codex work, one of the mechanisms to improve communication is to make optimum use of available electronic means of communication. However, any new proposal shall take account of the electronic communication capabilities (e.g. e-mail, Internet, etc.) of Codex Members of the Region. In view of this, the CCLAC Coordination developed a survey aimed at collecting data on the computer-related needs of the Region.
- 4. Argentina intends CCLAC to make the most of the recent advances in computational communications and the development of interconnection, which—together with the facilities provided by the Internet in services as well as in communications—have greatly contributed to facilitating information management in all decisive areas. Nevertheless, the development of new forms of communication should be harmonious and take into consideration real possibilities in all the countries in the region.

5. Last, the information obtained should be helpful to evaluate possible courses of action, in order to suggest actions to improve current conditions.

- 6. This survey was distributed to all CCLAC Member Countries in November 2003. Sixteen countries have responded to date<sup>1</sup>.
- 7. The CCLAC Chair would like to solicit Member Governments which have not responded to do so, so a thorough analysis may be conducted which provides the chance not only to evaluate other possible forms of communication among members but also to show the actual situation of CCLAC Members regarding the national capacity to use the most widely-used means for the exchange of information in Codex.
- 8. The survey on computer-related needs is annexed to this document. The data should be submitted by using the electronic Form (word file) to avoid re-typing of the data. This will ensure the accuracy of the information that will be compiled in a separate document for consideration by the 14<sup>th</sup> Session of the CCLAC. In view of the short time period between the submission of comments and the 14<sup>th</sup> Session of the Committee, comments received will be kept in original language. CCLAC Members who have already responded to the questionnaire<sup>1</sup> are kindly invited to re-send their comments so that they can be included in the document that will be presented at the next Session of the CCLAC.
