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## BACKGROUND

1. After publishing CX/FA 20/52/5, CCFA52 has been rescheduled to September 2021 due to the Covid 19 pandemic. The updated document of CX/FA 21/52/5, including more requests for endorsement of food additive provisions from Codex Committee on Processed Fruits and Vegetables (CCPFV), has been developed. Background information is available in CX/FA 21/52/5.
2. A virtual Working Group meeting on Endorsement scheduled on Friday 25 June will consider CX/FA 21/52/5, including the comments received in response to this circular letter.
3. Guidelines for comments is provided in Annex I.

## REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

4. In view of the complexity of the food additives provisions submitted by CCPFV as well as their close relationship with the alignment work, it is proposed to refer this matter for consideration by the EWG on alignment established by CCFA52.
5. In order to facilitate the discussion of the virtual Working Group meeting on Endorsement, Codex Members and Observers are invited to provide their comments on the above proposal (see para. 4) and other provisions submitted by various committees as contained in CX/FA 21/52/5.
6. Comments should be submitted through the Codex Contact Point or recognized international organizations having granted observer status with the Codex Alimentarius Commission. Comments should be formulated in accordance with the relevant general guidelines and presented in a Word file for easy analysis and compilation.

**GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR COMMENTS**

1. In order to facilitate the collection of comments and to prepare a useful document with all of them, Members and Observers are kindly requested to submit comments under the following headings:

(I) General comments

(II) Specific comments

2. In specific comments, a reference to the provision of the document in question should be included.

3. Members and Observers are requested, when proposing amendments to specific provisions, to accompany their proposed amendment with the appropriate technical basis.

4. In order to facilitate the work of the Secretariats, we kindly ask you to avoid texts with colors or shading, nor to use the change control, since the documents are printed in black and white, and the marks usually disappear when copying and pasting the comments in the compiled document.

5. Members and Observers are requested to avoid reproducing the full document, but only those parts of the text in which changes and / or amendments are proposed.
