VISA REQUIREMENTS

Delegates should begin the visa process as soon as possible by contacting the Consulate of Panama in their country or the closest Consulate of Panama (for stamped or authorized visas).

*Countries requiring an **AUTHORIZED VISA** should first apply for the visa at the accredited Panamanian consulate in each respective country. The consulate will then send the application to the Panamanian Immigration Service, which will make a joint decision with the National Security Council to authorize or deny the visa. The applicant must fill out the visa application form, meet the Panamanian Immigration Service's eligibility requirements, and provide a scanned copy of all passport pages.*

Note: If the passport is a diplomatic, consular, official, special, or service passport and requires an authorized visa, the application should be sent to the General Directorate of Foreign Policy of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Panama (with a note from the institution requesting the visa indicating the reasons for the trip, length of stay, and a scanned copy of the passport to receive authorization).

*Countries requiring a **STAMPED VISA** should apply for the visa at the accredited Panamanian consulate in their respective country. The applicant must fill out the stamped visa application form, provide a scanned copy of their passport, and meet the eligibility requirements of the Panamanian Immigration Service.*

Citizens of these countries may stay in Panama for up to 6 months. The maximum length of stay for Colombian and Nicaraguan nationals has been reduced to 90 days. If more time is required, the citizen should visit the offices of the Panamanian Immigration Service to apply for a different immigration status.

Laissez-passer passport holders (United Nations passport) do not require a visa; they must attach a note or certification indicating that they are traveling on behalf and in representation of the UN.

The following Executive Decrees should also be taken into consideration:

Executive Decree No. 591, December 28, 2016

Removes the visa requirement for those persons holding a multiple entry visa to the United States of America, Australia, Canada, and the United Kingdom. The visa must have been previously used in the issuing country and be valid for at least one year from the date of entry into Panama.

Executive Decree No. 591, December 28, 2016

Removes the visa requirement for those persons holding a multiple entry Schengen visa or who are a current resident of the European Union. The visa must have been previously used in the issuing country and be valid for at least one year from the date of entry into Panama.

VISA APPLICATION FORMS

The required documents and visa application forms are available in our official language of Spanish and in English, as it is a widely-used international language, but not in French. They can be obtained at:

The Stamped or Authorized visa incurs a fee of B/ 50.00 per immigration service and B/ 10.00 consular fee (Tax Code, Executive Decree No. 113).

We urge you to send the documentation for your visa in a timely manner to ensure sufficient time to process your application.
