Experiences in HAITI Port-au-Prince and Jérémie (project OSRO/HAI/703/CAN)

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Background



Lack of opportunities in rural area, and no land and natural ressources tenure

Very little investement in agriculture

Growing urban population with, 70% living in township



Project rationale



- High demand for vegetables and fresh food during the rainy season

- Insuficient production in Haiti, imports from Dominican Rep.
- A project was designed with the following objectives:
 -increase food availability
 -help poor urban households diversify their income

Activities



Support to vegetable growing



A "hanging garden" in a township of Port au Prince



School children growing vegetables on the roof top of their school

- 1600 families started vegetable production
- Children of 5 schools and 1 orphanage were sensitized to vegetable growing



Support to poultry production

1 200 families established a unit for poultry production



The two-weeks production of an urban household



• Training and technical support



A training in a school of Port au Prince

Difficulties



Security problems in some areas:
 Cité Soleil, Demonstrations in April 2008

-Lack of space and need to be «creative»

- Introducing the concept of «self-help» when people are used to recieving.

- Sustainability of the activities?

Lack of funding facilities to buy inputs (seeds, poultry)

Perspectives



- An intervention that targets the most vulnerable
- This is only a pliot to build on the work acheived and there is much more to do.
- How do we learn and replicate with partners and ensure viability of the support?
