# **UNSCN Mandate**

The UNSCN is mandated to be a point of convergence in harmonizing nutrition policies and activities and providing initiative in the development and harmonization of concepts, policies, strategies and programmes in response to nutritional needs of countries.

Connections between food security, agriculture and nutrition are still very week and need strengthening



- 1. Being built by countries 20 countries engaged as "early risers".
- 2. Greater donor alignment in these countries and globally
- 3. Civil society and private sector engagement mechanisms being developed
- 4. One UN support through UNSCN ExCom and REACH
- 5. High-level SUN 1 year meeting at UNGA (20th September 2011) reinforced commitments for this collective endeavor



- 1. Better understand and articulate linkages between food security, agriculture, social protection and nutrition to see increased investment on food security and agriculture translate into better nutritional outcomes.
- 2. Do more work on:
- what 'nutrition-sensitive' food security and agriculture look like (examples)
- how they can be implemented at the field level (guidance)
- how a nutrition impact assessment should be conducted at early stages of agriculture and food security programming (guidelines)
- how to monitor and evaluate these efforts (M&E)

The UNSCN will facilitate work of UN agencies on these.

3. Ensure Global Strategic Framework for Food Security and Nutrition (in drafting) of the CFS promotes a well-defined and coherent approach to 'nutrition-sensitive' agriculture and food security.
