Prince Kamara has over twenty years' experience in development work, policy planning and advocacy to overcome poverty. He is a coordinator and technical back-stopper in the development/formulation and evaluation of national investment plans/programmes within the CAADP country implementation processes. Has a Masters degree in Economic Policy Management from the University of Ghana, Legon.

He is currently the CAADP Focal Person and the coordinator of the National Agricultural Investment Plan (NAIP) in Sierra Leone, Smallholder Commercialization Program (SCP). He is also the principal technical adviser to the Honourable Minster of Agriculture, Forestry and Food Security (MAFFS). He works very closely with the Agricultural Donors Working Group (ADWG), public and priv ate investors, farmers, civil society and other non-state actors. He coordinates the Presidential Task Force on Agriculture (PTFAg) and the Agricultural Advisory Group (AAG) in Sierra Leone.
