STATEMENT OF THE DELEGATION OF INDONESIA

Third Open-Ended Working Group Meeting on Data collection and analysis tools for food security and nutrition

Thank you, Anthony, our dear Rapporteur.

First and foremost, thank you to the Rapporteur and the Secretariat for providing the zero draft as a basis for our discussion today.

As we tried to read the draft carefully and thoroughly, allow us to provide some additional inputs to the zero draft for further consideration.

<u>First</u>, we could not agree more on the overall goal of the document to provide specific and actionable voluntary policy recommendation for strengthening the capacities of actors involved in the collection, analysis, dissemination and the use of quality FSN data.

It means, in a broader sense, we need two important variables to achieve it, 1) capacity building; 2) adequate resources/infrastructures. This will be the main factors that we need to discuss further during the negotiation.

Second, there should be consistency applied when using the term "Food Security and Nutrition data" or "agriculture data". We found the using of both terms in the document, and we need to determine which one would be the right term for the document, bearing in mind also the possibility and risk of having such repetition and duplication with other for a.

<u>Third</u>, we support to provide enabling environment through global coordination.

<u>Fourth</u>, we support as well the emphasize on strikes the right balance between data access and sharing, on the one hand, and data protections, privacy rights and control, on the other.

<u>Fifth</u>, fully agree to clearly mentioned that this policy are voluntary and non-binding.

Since the policy would be voluntary implemented at country level, according to its national law and policy, we would also like to propose "national ownership" or "country ownership" as one of the principles to be included in the policy recommendation.

<u>Sixth</u>, we take note the notion of "agriculture and FSN data for the public good", in line with UN Secretary General Data Strategy and Roadmap for Digital Cooperation.

<u>Seventh</u>, we support the mentioning of South-South and Triangular Cooperation in the last part of document, although we would like to also

suggest the mentioning of it in part 1 or part 3 when we are talking about awareness and human capital. (Argentina)

Lastly, we still have a doubt over some proposal in terms of their feasibilities included in the zero draft such as, Global FSN Data Trust Fund.

We would like to be more clear **on the principles of CARE and FAIR** that we are using, instead we would propose to use the principles provided in UN Secretary General Data Strategy and Roadmap for Digital Cooperation.
