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1. Introduction

1.1 Aim and collection unit

This publication presents estimates in respect of the Census of Commercial Agriculture (CoCA), 2017 – Western Cape. The survey aims to provide financial, production, employment and related information for the commercial agriculture industry in South Africa.

The last CoCA was conducted in 2007 (Reports No. 11-02-02 (2007)).

It is important to note that in 2007 the collection unit was a farming enterprise. The collection unit for CoCA 2017 is a farming unit, where a farming unit consists of one or more farms, holdings or pieces of land, whether adjacent or not, operated as a single unit and situated within the same local municipality. In this report, the word farm means farming unit.

1.2 Scope and coverage

CoCA 2017 covers enterprises registered for value added tax (VAT) and which are mainly or primarily engaged in the following activities classified according to the January 1993 edition of the Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC), Fifth edition.

- Growing of crops, market gardening and horticulture (SIC 111),
- Farming of animals (SIC 112),
- A combination of the above (mixed farming) (SIC 113),
- Agricultural and animal husbandry services, except veterinary activities (SIC 114), and
- Game propagation, including related services (SIC 1151).

1.3 Data items

The following categories of data items were collected: general information, land use, field crops, horticultural crops, animals, employment, income, expenditure and details of purchases.

1.4 Reference period

The questionnaires were completed for the financial year ended on any date between 1 March 2017 and 28 February 2018, according to the usual reporting schedule of the enterprise, with the following exceptions:

- Animals on farms as at 30 September 2018, and
- Employment as at 30 June 2018.

1.5 Current prices

The rand values are at current prices.

1.6 Reliability of data

The following are some of the likely sources of non-sampling errors: frame not up to date, wrong definitions and classification, phrasing of questions, non-response, processing and estimation. Every effort is made to minimise non-sampling errors by updating the frame, careful design of questionnaires, testing them with a sample of respondents, editing reported data and implementing efficient operating procedures. Non-sampling errors occur in both sample surveys and censuses.

1.7 Confidentiality

According to section 17 of the Statistics Act, 1999 (Act No. 6 of 1999), completed questionnaires remain confidential to Statistics South Africa (Stats SA). Individual business information is never disclosed. Results are presented in aggregated form only.

2. Key findings

2.1 Farming units, income, and employment


The total number of farms/ farming units involved in the commercial agriculture industry in 2017 was 6 937. The largest proportion of farms was in horticulture (2 266 farms or 32,7% of the total), followed by mixed farming (1 886 or 27,2%) and farming of animals (1 501 or 21,6%).

The district municipality with the highest number of farms in 2017 was Cape Winelands (1 995 farms or 28,8% of the provincial total), followed by West Coast (1 543 or 22,2%) and Eden (1 270 or 18,3%).

The total income for the commercial agriculture industry in 2017 was R64,4 billion, which was 245% higher than the R18,6 billion recorded for 2007. In 2017, the major contributor to total income was horticulture (R26,8 billion or 41,5%), followed by mixed farming (R16,6 billion or 25,8%) and farming of animals (R13,6 billion or 21,2%).


The district municipality contributing the most to total income in 2017 was Cape Winelands (R27,3 billion or 42,4%), followed by West Coast (R13,5 billion or 20,9%) and Overberg (R10,1 billion or 15,7%).

The total number of persons employed in commercial agriculture on 30 June 2018 was 186 998, down from 204 513 on 28 February 2007 (-8,6%). In terms of employment, the major commercial agriculture activity in 2017 was horticulture (107 381 employees or 57,4% of the total), followed by mixed farming (38 610 or 20,6%) and farming of animals (20 470 or 11,0%).


Figure 1 - Number of farms, income and employment in the commercial agriculture industry by farm size, as a percentage of total, 2017

In 2017, 550 large farms (those with annual income of more than R22,5 million) constituted 7,9% of the total number of farms in the commercial agriculture industry, and accounted for 65,1% of total income and 53,0% of total employment. This was in contrast to the 2 895 micro farms (annual income below R1 million) which made up 41,7% of the total number of farms, but which accounted for just 1,5% of total income and 4,7% of total employment. Taken together, there were 3 092 large, medium and small farms in 2017, with combined shares of 44,6% of the number of farms, 96,2% of income, and 91,2% of employment.

Measured by farm size, small farming units were the second largest in terms of number of farms, income and employment in 2017.

Horticulture had the largest share of the number of farms in 2017 (32,7%) as well as the highest share of income (41,6%) and employment (57,4%). Second largest was mixed farming (27,2% of number of farms, 25,8% of income and 20,6% of employment).

Cape Winelands district municipality recorded the largest share of the province in all three categories in 2017 (28,8% of number of farms, 42,4% of income and 49,9% of employment). West Coast had the second largest share in all three categories.

Of the total income of R64,4 billion in the commercial agriculture industry in 2017, R56,4 billion was derived directly from agricultural activities, which is herein referred to as gross farming income. The horticultural products category was the biggest contributor to gross farming income with 46,6% of the provincial total, followed by animal and animal products (37,0%). Horticultural products accounted for 60,4% of gross farming income in the Cape Winelands district municipality, and animals and animal products accounted for 32,1%.

2.2 Land use

On 30 September 2018 the total land used for commercial agriculture in Western Cape was 4,1 million hectares, which represents 31,7% of the total land area of Western Cape (12,9 million hectares). Commercial agricultural land in Western Cape comprised mainly grazing land (2,7 million hectares) and arable land (1,0 million hectares). Grazing land is used for livestock and game farming, and arable land is used for crop production.

The Central Karoo district accounted for the largest share of Western Cape's commercial agricultural land (44,4%), followed by West Coast (16,6%), Eden (13,4%) and Cape Winelands (12,8%). City of Cape Town (0,9%) recorded the smallest share.

Regarding grazing land, over 80,0% was located in three districts, namely Central Karoo (62,9%), West Coast (13,7%) and Eden (11,8%). Four districts accounted for over 90,0% of arable land, namely Overberg (31,7%), West Coast (23,9%), Cape Winelands (20,1%) and Eden (16,7%).

2.3 Field crops

Field crops are important for food security, and they account for the largest portion of cultivated land in South Africa. In terms of area planted, the major field crops in Western Cape in both 2007 and 2017 were wheat, barley and canola. All major field crops were mostly planted under dry land. Barley had the highest proportion (97,6% of barley) planted under dry land in 2017, followed by wheat (97,5%) and canola (97,5%).

Between 2007 and 2017, wheat production decreased by 32,1% (from 573 thousand to 389 thousand tons). However, there was an increase in the volume of production per hectare from 2,49 to 2,54 tons. The Overberg district produced 41,7% of wheat in the Western Cape province in 2017, followed by West Coast (37,6%) and Eden (9,1%).

Barley production increased by 14,5% from (117 thousand to 134 thousand tons) between 2007 and 2017. Two districts accounted for 97,7% of the province's total in 2017, namely Overberg (88,2%) and Eden (9,6%).

Canola is produced commercially mainly in the Western Cape province (98,7% of the national total). Over half of canola production (61,4%) is from Overberg district.

2.4 Horticultural crops

2.4.1 Vegetables

The major vegetables in terms of area planted were potatoes, onions, carrots and tomatoes. Potatoes and tomatoes showed substantial decreases in area planted, whereas onions and carrots showed increases.

Regarding production, there were increases of 44,9% in onions (from 149 thousand to 216 thousand tons) and 26,8% in carrots (from 32 thousand to 40 thousand tons) between 2007 and 2017. Potatoes and tomatoes showed declines in production of 134 thousand and 19 thousand tons respectively.

In 2017, the three leading districts in onion production were Cape Winelands (70,8% of the provincial total), Central Karoo (19,5%) and West Coast (8,4%). The largest proportion of the province's potatoes was produced in the West Coast district (70,6%), followed by Cape Winelands (23,7%) and Eden (3,5%). City of Cape Town, Cape Winelands and West Coast produced over 80,0% of the province's carrots in 2017. More than 80,0% of tomatoes in the Western Cape province were produced in two districts, namely Cape Winelands (62,7%) and West Coast (18,1%).

The largest proportions of all four of the major vegetables produced were sold through fresh produce markets. These were the largest marketing channel for onions (74,7%), potatoes (52,1%), carrots (58,8%) and tomatoes (34,0%).

1.5 Fruits

2.5.1 Citrus fruits

Citrus fruits continue to play an important role in the economy, with strong links to packaging, processing and distribution in the agriculture value chain. Oranges accounted for 4 694 hectares planted in 2017, down by 40,4% from 2007. There were large increases in naartjies and lemons in terms of area planted (well over 100% in each case).

Regarding production, naartjies increased by 76,0% between 2007 and 2017 (from 33 thousand to 57 thousand tons), and lemons increased by 18,3% (from 35 thousand to 41 thousand tons). Oranges fell by 23,1% (from 203 thousand to 156 thousand tons). Compared with 2007, both naartjies and lemons showed a decrease in volume of production per hectare in 2017 while oranges showed an increase.

Oranges were mainly produced in the West Coast district (94,8%) in 2017. Three districts produced 99,9% of the province's naartjies: West Coast (66,9%), Cape Winelands (25,0%) and Overberg (8,0%). The three leading districts in lemon production in 2017 were Cape Winelands (46,3%), West Coast (43,4%) and City of Cape Town (5,6%).

Most of the 2017 production of naartjies (95,3%), oranges (79,0%) and lemons (75,8%) was exported. The second largest marketing/distribution channel for oranges (10,8%) and lemons (10,7%) was through processing factories, while 3,1% of naartjies were sold to fresh produce markets.

2.5.2 Deciduous fruits and viticulture

Like other activities within the agriculture industry, the deciduous fruit and viticulture sector is continually changing and evolving to adapt to industry and climate demands. In terms of area planted, apples, pears and table grapes showed increases between 2007 and 2017 whereas wine grapes fell by 33,2%.

Nevertheless, within major deciduous fruit and viticulture, wine grapes remained the most planted (in hectares) in both years. Between 2007and 2017, apple production increased by 17,4% (from 665 thousand to 781 thousand tons) and pears decreased by 0,3% (from 317 thousand to 316 thousand tons). Grape production fell between 2007 and 2017: table grapes and wine grapes decreased, respectively, by 16,7% (from 233 thousand to 194 thousand tons) and by 31,5% (from 987 thousand to 676 thousand tons). Compared with 2007, wine grapes showed an increase in production per hectare in 2017 while apples, pears and table grapes all showed a decrease.

The two leading districts in apple production in 2017 were Overberg (46,1% of the provincial total) and Cape Winelands (44,9%). Most of the pears in the province were produced in Cape Winelands (70,7%). Most of the province's table grapes were produced in the Cape Winelands (65,7%) and West Coast (30,4%) districts. Over 70,0% of wine grapes in Western Cape were produced in Cape Winelands (78,3%).

Significant amounts of table grapes (70,8%), pears (55,0%) and apples (45,7%) were exported in 2017; wine grapes (89,6%) were mostly sold to processing factories.

2.6 Animals

Cattle, sheep, pigs and chickens are the most reared animals in commercial agriculture in the Western Cape province.

Between 2007 and 2017, the number of cattle sold increased by 128,2% (from 161 thousand to 368 thousand). The leading district in cattle sales in 2017 were Overberg (81,5% of the province's total). However, the number of cattle on farm in the province decreased by 17,1% (from 351 thousand to 291 thousand) between 2007 and 2018.

Compared with 2007, the number of sheep sold in 2017 decreased by 54,5% (from 1,1 million to 502 thousand). Most sheep were sold in the Overberg district (48,5%), Central Karoo (19,0%) and Eden (15,1%). The number of sheep on farm fell by 34,7% (from 1,7 million to 1,1 million). On 30 September 2018, Overberg district (40,1%), Central Karoo (23,1%) and Eden (18,6%) were leading in number of sheep on farm.

There was an increase of 11,4% (from 191 thousand to 213 thousand) in the number of pigs sold between 2007 and 2017. Pigs were sold mainly in West Coast (53,9%) and Cape Winelands (32,9%) in 2017. Between 2007 and 2018, the number of pigs on farm increased by 61,8% (from 102 thousand to 164 thousand). Cape Winelands (30,6%) had the highest number of pigs on farm in 2018, followed by West Coast (30,0%) and City of Cape Town (25,7%).

The number of chickens sold fell by 61,6% between 2007 and 2017 (from 166 million to 64 million). In 2018, the largest number of chicken sales took place in the following three districts: West Coast (48,0%), Cape Winelands (22,5%) and City of Cape Town (15,4%); and West Coast (56,8%), Cape Winelands (27,4%) and City of Cape Town (13,5%) reported the largest number of chickens on farm.

Explanatory notes

Background

The results presented in this publication have been derived from the Census of Commercial Agriculture (CoCA), 2017 – Western Cape. This publication summarises data on the size, structure and nature of the commercial agriculture industry.

The frame was drawn from Stats SA's business register. The business register is mainly based on the value added tax (VAT) database of the South African Revenue Service (SARS).

The last CoCA was conducted for the year 2007 (Report No. 11-02-02 (2007)).

Value added tax (VAT)

All figures exclude value added tax (VAT).

Reference period

The information was collected from enterprises for their financial year which ended on any date between 01 March 2018 and 28 February 2019.

Statistical unit

The statistical unit is an enterprise. An enterprise is a legal unit (or a combination of legal units) that includes and directly controls all functions necessary to carry out its production activities.

Collection unit

The collection unit is a farming unit. A farming unit consists of one or more farms, holdings or pieces of land, whether adjacent or not, operated as a single unit and situated within the same local municipality. Thus, an enterprise can have one or more farming units.

Classification

The 1993 edition of the Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (SIC), Fifth Edition, Report No. 09-09-02, was used to classify the statistical units in this census. The SIC is based on the third revision of the 1990 International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC), with suitable adaptations for local conditions. Farming sectors included were classified to the five-digit (subgroup) level for the detailed results.

Size groups

The enterprises are divided into four size groups according to the value of turnover recorded for them on the Stats SA business register. Table I presents the cut-off points for size groups.

Survey methodology and design

Initially, telephones were used to contact enterprises and update their information on the frame in terms of specific agriculture activity and location. Enterprises were given an option of either self-enumeration or a visit by a Stats SA official. CAPI (Computer Assisted Personal Interview), on both tablet and desktop, was used to conduct the interview and/or capture the data.

Collection rate

Collection rate = ((collected enterprises + finalised investigations) / sample size) * 100. The collection rate was 76,9%.

Turnover collection rate	Turnover collection rate = ((collected enterprises BR turnover + finalised investigations BR turnover) / population BR turnover) * 100. The turnover collection rate was 88,9%.
