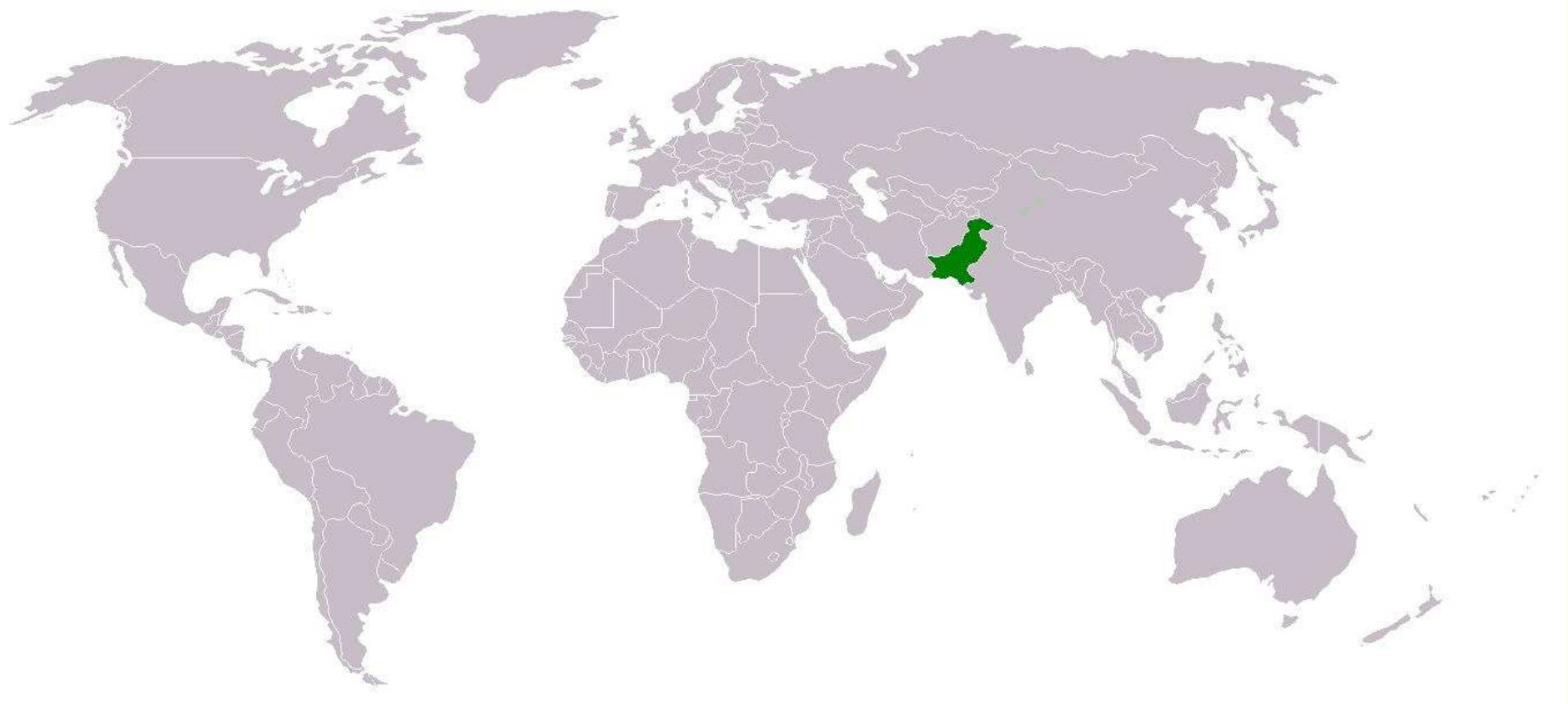

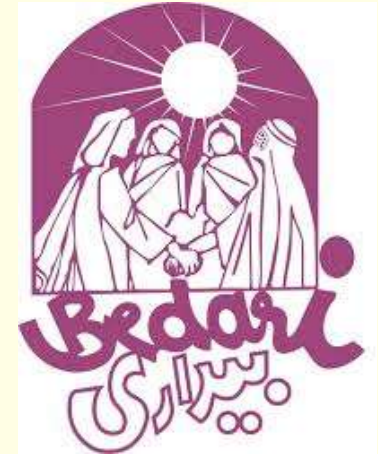

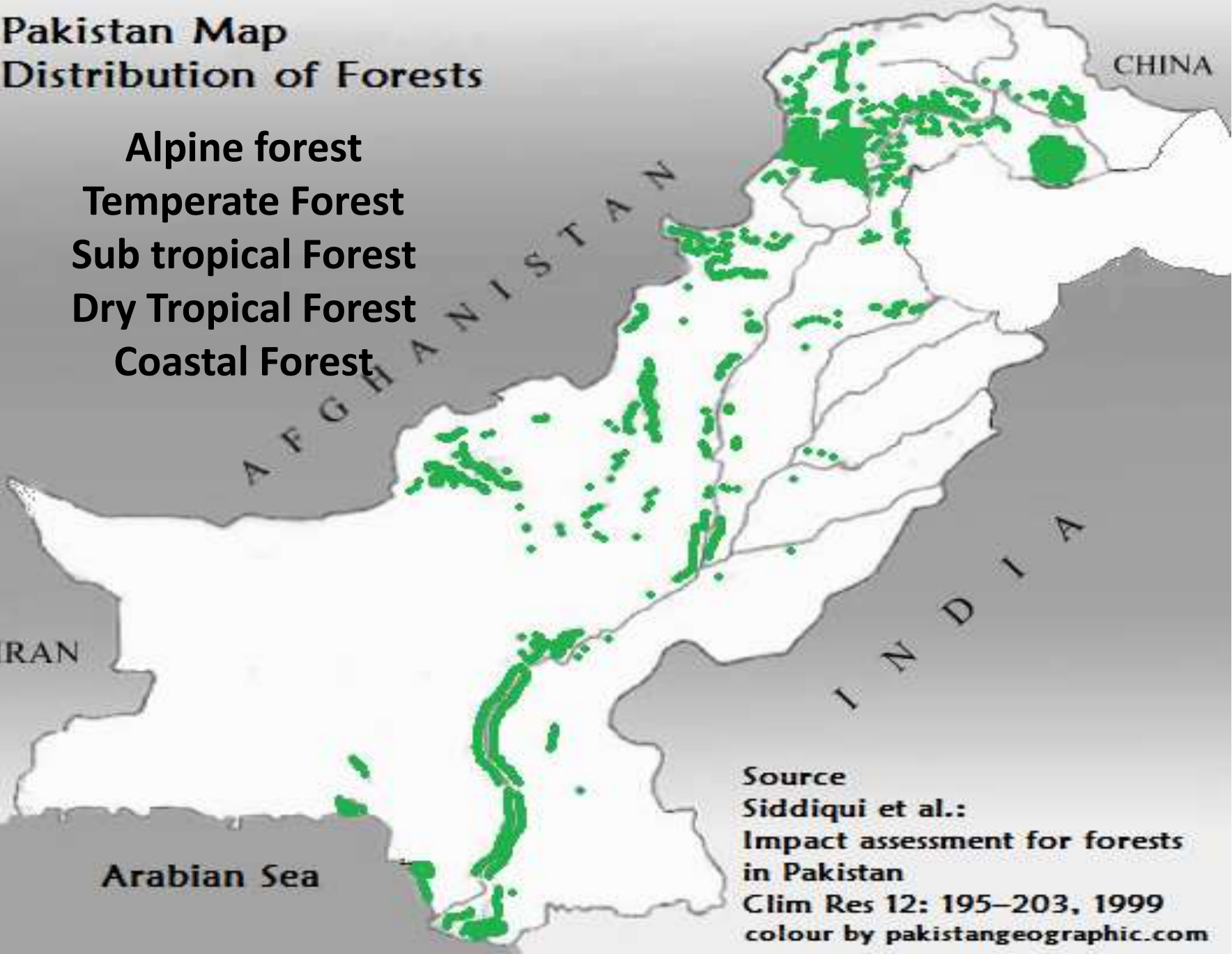

- Forest area : 40224 million hac , 4.8 of the total land cover
- Most forest resources of Pakistan are concentrated in the mountainous regions of the north covering **Himalaya, Hindukush** and **Karakoram ranges**, where more than 60% of the country natural forest resources are found.
- The rest of forestry resource is distributed among the **south-western mountains** of Baluchistan, plains of Punjab and Sindh and the coastal areas of Arabian Sea in the south.
- KPK housed 40 percent forest
