Useful information for participants

Background information

Senegal, officially the Republic of Senegal, is a country in West Africa, bounded by the Atlantic Ocean to the west, Mauritania to the north, Mali to the east, and Guinea and Guinea-Bissau to the south. Dakar is the capital and largest city of Senegal with a population of more than one million people. Located on the Cap-Vert peninsula, Dakar is one of the major seaports on the western African coast. The official language of Senegal is French. Other languages spoken are Wolof, Pulaar, Serer, Diola and Mandingo.

Senegal has a tropical climate with pleasant heat throughout the year and dry and humid seasons that result from northeast winter winds and southwest summer winds. Dakar's annual rainfall of about 600 mm (24 inches) occurs between June and October when maximum temperatures average 30 °C and minimums 24.2 °C.

The currency in Senegal is the CFA franc (XOF). The current exchange rate is 1 USD = 660.684 XOF and 1 Euro = 655.957 XOF (September 2022).

The international dialing code for Senegal is +221. This country code, along with the area code, is required to call a telephone number in Senegal from another country.

In Dakar, the standard voltage is 230V and the frequency is 50Hz. You can use all your equipment if the outlet voltage in your own country is between 220V-240V.
