Join us on the 2nd FISH4ACP Virtual Tour which will bring you the freshest information on the development of the FISH4ACP project. This time our journey will lead us to discover two new value chains working with the FISH4ACP project (oysters in Senegal and small pelagics in Lake Tanganyika, Tanzania), while deepening our understanding of the Guyanese shrimp value chain, where this time we will meet a generational artisanal processing family of that chain.

As in our previous broadcast, this event will feature interviews and live discussions with local stakeholders directly involved in fisheries value chain activities. It will also actively engage the audience in discussions on a host of issues related to sustainable value chain development, food and nutrition security, and livelihoods, including the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Background and Rationale

FISH4ACP is an initiative of the Organisation of African, Caribbean and Pacific States (OACPS) contributing to food and nutrition security, economic prosperity and job creation by ensuring the economic, social and environmental sustainability of fisheries and aquaculture value chains in Africa, the Caribbean and the Pacific. FISH4ACP is implemented by FAO and partners with funding from the European Union (EU) and the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ).

FISH4ACP seeks to enhance the productivity and competitiveness of twelve fisheries and aquaculture value chains in twelve OACPS member countries, making sure that economic improvements go hand in hand with environmental sustainability and social inclusiveness. It will pay special attention to small and medium-sized businesses, to boost their potential to deliver economic and social benefits, particularly those of women and young people.
