

### **CESRA Steering Committee**



- CESRA Steering Committee was established in 2023 and the first meeting was held in June 2023.
- During the meeting, the CESRA Term of Reference was **revised** and **endorsed** with some key function as the Technical Committee was included to CESRA function.
- The document was published on CESRA website









#### TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

- The Technical Committee comprises of **9 members**
- 6 soil experts from Asian countries plus 3 from international organizations and will be selected by the CESRA's Steering Committee through a competitive process every 3 years.
- The committee will be responsible for facilitation the academic aspects of CESRA.
- A call for application to be members of the technical committee has been circulated to the National Focal Points of each country.
- All the names will be presented to the Steering Committees for selection /at the next Steering Committees meeting in May 2024.
- The names of TCs will be announced by June 2024.
- The first technical committee meeting will be held in July 2024.

#### **CESRA Forum**



- CESRA Forum, is an annual meeting of all CESRA members.
- The first CESRA forum was held in September 2022, in Bangkok, Thailand.
- Participants from **19 organizations** of **10 countries**, including Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, India, the Philippines, China, Mongolia, and Thailand.
- The outcomes from the forum include:
  - **Sharing and exchanging** knowledge, experience, and best practices on soil management from different countries, with knowledge gaps in soil research of member organizations used in preparing the potential development plan of CESRA members.
  - **List of funding** sources both domestic and international that can support research funding for 11 CESRA member organizations.
  - Agreement on the proposal development in 3 topics including soil erosion, soil salinization and soil carbon.

#### CESRA Forum



- The **second CESRA forum** will be organized in **August 2024** in hybrid both online and onsite in Bangkok.
- There will be a presentation of the outstanding activities on soil and sustainable soil management of member organizations.
- Also, the forum aims to develop regional research proposals, building on the 3 topics that were mutually agreed upon and develop new topics of research proposals, including organizing a meeting of the working group of Department of Soil Research Development.


#### SSM BEST PRACTICES

- If this is agreed, we will communicate with WOCAT and find solutions for CESRA and Members to share information and knowledge through this link.


#### CAPACITY BUILDING


