International UN Day adopted by the UN General Assembly in Dec 2013 (mandate to GSP/FAO)



Every year on 5 December – this year will be its 8th official celebration

- ✓ **Invite & engage people** to take action.






What do we usually do?

- □ **Develop and prepare key messages** targeting wide audience (FAO official languages + other languages)
- □ **Develop and launch the campaign** (3rd quarter 2021) with communication toolkit
- □ **Propose activities** such as contest, competitions, soil labs...
- □ **Encourage WSD events**, exchange ideas and liaise continuously with event organizers
- □ Strive to work and engage with new partners and new countries (media, private sector, schools, etc. ...)
- □ **Alert our audience** with special announcements & newsletters
- □ **Strive to disseminate** to a very large audience

- **■** Monitor success and analyse data
- □ **Compile report** post-WSD

Engage with the youth!




NGOs
