

West Africa Soil Doctors Network

- Proposal to USAID for a small-scale 16 month Farmer to Farmer program
- Farmer to Farmer provides US-based technical experts to conduct trainings on agricultural topics of interest to individual countries
- Focused on Sierra Leone, Liberia and Gambia
- Concept:
 - a. Provide two 2-person teams to conduct two weeks of trainings in each country
 - b. First team focused on basic soil training, limited advanced training
 - c. Second team focused on advanced training with some additional basic soil training
 - d. A train-the-trainer model to help catalyze the country specific Soil Doctor programs
 - e. Develop relationships between regional Soil Doctors

- No current Farmer to Farmer programs exist in these countries, but additional grant opportunities do arise.
