

Are RSPs Making a Difference?



Usefulness of RSPs >>> Rating: 7.7/10 The results emphasise that...

- RSPs provide valuable support and meet stakeholders' expectations
- continued support for RSPs is important





Key Improvement Areas:

- Strengthen regional cooperation and active participation
- Tailor mission statements and align regional interests
- Enhance **planning, funding**, and programming
- Improve virtual interactions and support for focal points
- Provide resources for RSP meetings and activities

"Strategically assign a **mission** adapted for each region"



The Importance of RSPs Governance

Should RSPs maintain their own governance?

Autonomy in decision-making: YES: 67, NO: 11 >> 85% YES

Key Messages

- Majority supports RSPs maintaining their governance structure
- Strengthening collaboration with relevant regional bodies



Some Remarks from the FPs

- Involve regional partners in decision-making process
- Develop short- and long-term plans with regional partner inputs
- Conduct regular meetings (at least annually) and consultations
- Coordinate with national focal points and FAO regional offices
- Organize regional conferences, workshops, and trainings







- Majority supports electing working groups and group chairs for different action areas
- Targeting different soil related issues in order to achieve effective outcomes



Empowering Regional Partners in Decision-

making

How and when should regional partners be included in decisionmaking at RSPs level? involving regional partners in short- and long-term plans, discussions, and consultations...

Annual forums, voting, and participation for collective decisionmaking.

Empowering Regional Partners in Decisionmaking?



Collaboration: RSPs and Global Technical

Networks

- Strong support for collaboration: YES: 77, NO: 1
- Information sharing and cooperation with global technical networks enhances RSPs' effectiveness



RSPs Taking Charge with Specific Actions

In your opinion and in the understanding that each region has their own context and priorities, what specific actions should the Regional Soil Partnerships play?

- Developing regional activities within and beyond the scope of the GSP
- Fostering technical and scientific exchange
- Organizing engaging awareness-raising activities and campaigns
- Supporting resource mobilization, implementation plans, and collaboration
- Keeping countries informed and connected



Conclusion

- RSPs: Crucial catalysts for improving soil management practices and promoting sustainable soil management
- Survey results can act as a valuable roadmap for strengthening RSPs and fostering global collaboration towards 2030



TAKEAWAY MESSAGES

- **1)** Increased collaboration and communication: strengthen cooperation among regional countries and facilitate knowledge sharing, experience exchange, and joint project implementation.
- 2) Adaptation to regional contexts: RSPs should adapt global plans and guidelines to specific regional policies and national soil conditions, ensuring the most effective and relevant strategies are pursued.
- **3)** Support for national soil institutions: RSPs should provide support and build capacity for national soil institutions, helping to harmonize interventions and promote sustainable soil management.



TAKEAWAY MESSAGES

4) **Resource mobilization:** RSPs should play a key role in mobilizing financial resources

- **5)** Active engagement and participation: RSPs should encourage active participation from all member countries, and influence the decision-making processes, fostering a sense of ownership and commitment.
- 6) Addressing regional priorities: RSPs should work to identify and address the specific soil-related challenges and priorities within their region, taking into account local needs and interests.
- **7)** Capacity building and training: RSPs should focus on building capacity, offering training, and promoting best practices in sustainable soil management across the region.
