- The mission is to support and facilitate joint efforts towards reducing the risks of soil pollution and effectively remediate already polluted areas








The importance of INSOP

- > 100,000 synthetic chemicals produced
- > 10 million potentially contaminated



4.9 million deaths were attributable to environmental exposure and management of selected chemicals in 2004.³



- It will work on improving knowledge on the full cycle of soil pollution, from assessment to remediation, as well as on the effect on environmental and human health and the provision of soil ecosystem functions and services

INSOP collaboration

INSOP will closely collaborate with other networks in order to achieve its global goal in eliminating soil pollutions. Examples of future collaborations are:

- ➤ GLOSOLAN: Harmonizing SOP's for soil contaminants. Creating the list of priority contaminants. Lab's capacity and equipment assessment
- ➤ INSII: Develop the methodology to map soil pollution. Generation of a spatial datasets on the distribution of polluted soils.
- ➤ **NETSOB**: Sustainable use and management of soil biodiversity for remediation and management of contaminated soils











How the Plenary can support INSOP?

- Encourage the participation of national experts in the Network.
- Contribute to the compilation of national information on polluted soils.
- Participate in efforts to prevent, regulate and control soil pollution.
- Advocate for the consideration of soil pollution in all related fora, e.g. One Health.
- Fund INSOP activities, from awareness raising and capacity building to field demonstrations to manage and remediate polluted soils.
