









#### World Soil Day 2021 Kids2Kids poster contest

- Honors individuals or organizations committed to solving acute national, regional or local problems of soil degradation
- Consists of a Glinka Medal and a check of USD 15 000 in memory of the prominent Russian scientist Konstantin D. Glinka
- ❖ 17 applications from several countries were considered, and the winner was invited to attend a virtual awarding ceremony on WSD 2021


