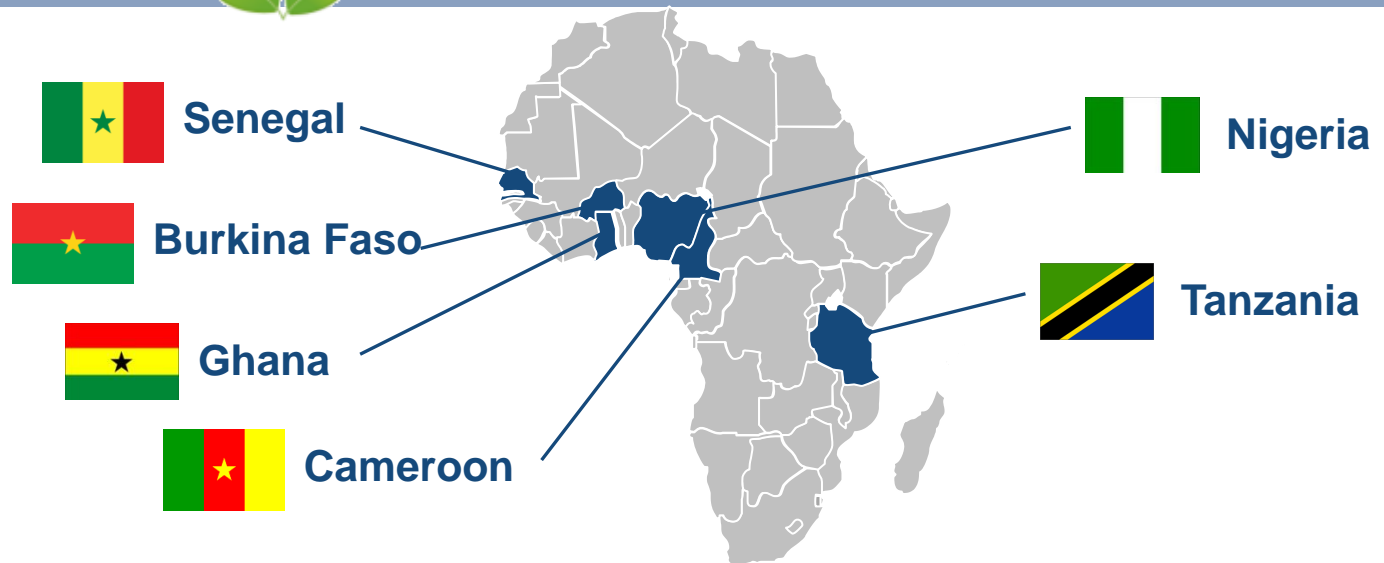

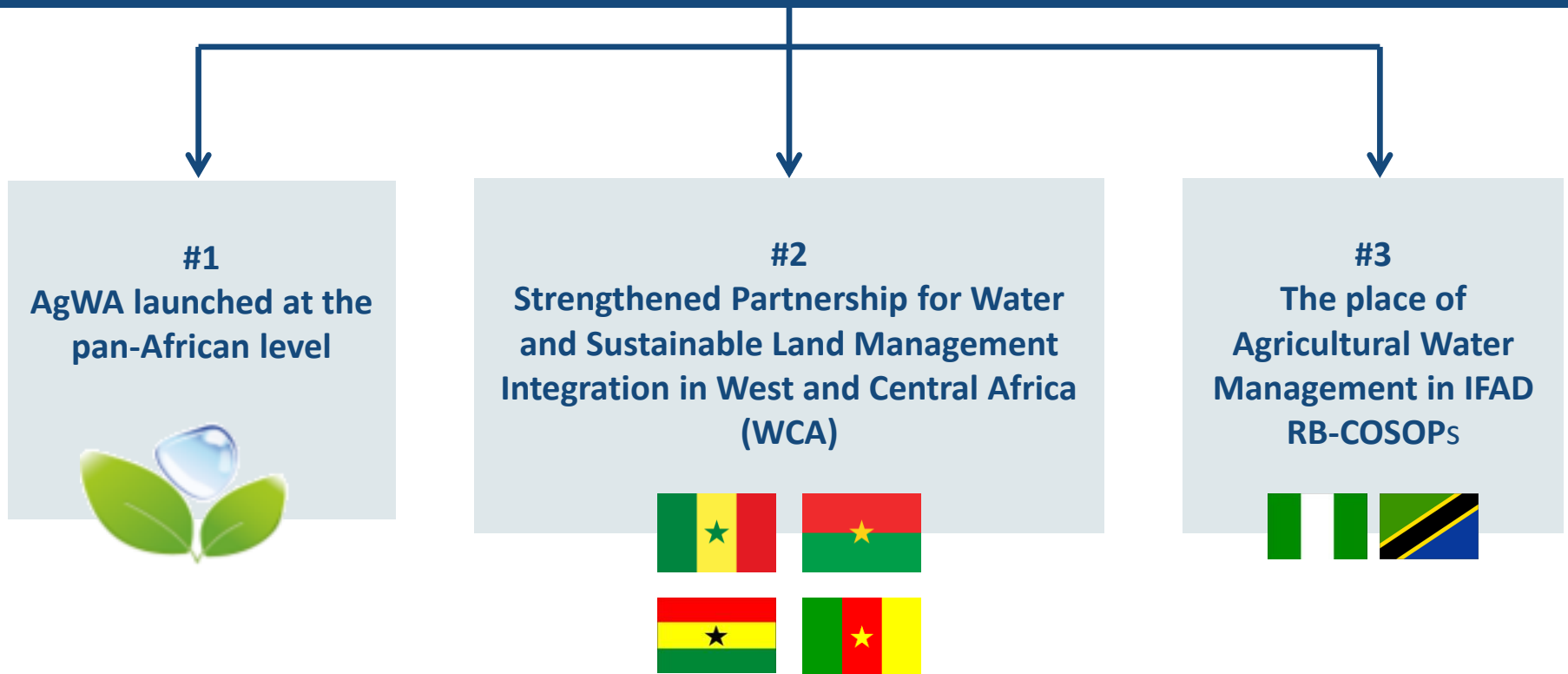

AgWA launched at the pan-African level



Activities

- ✓ Support AgWA to establish **its new secretariat** at the pan-African level (hosted at FAO-Eastern Africa in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia)
- ✓ Support AgWA in **forging strong partnership** with: WaterNet, IMAWESA, SEARNet, PELUM and SARIA from the East and Southern Africa Regional Steering Committee (ESASC); WRCC/ECOWAS, ARID, CILSS, 2IE and OMVS from the West & Central Africa Regional Steering Committee (WCASC); NPCA, IWMI, FAO and FARA; and IFAD, AfDB, WB (as non-voting members)
- ✓ Help AgWA partners **design and agree on the way they will be collaborating** in sharing and allocating responsibilities
- ✓ Support AgWA in **learning lessons** from other 'similar' Secretariats (including inter alia FARA, CILSS, International Land Coalition and UN-Water), and from TerrAfrica

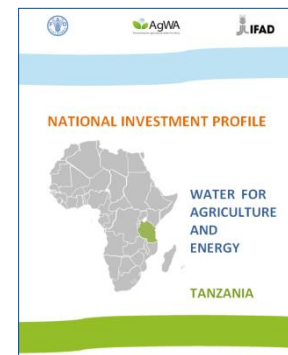
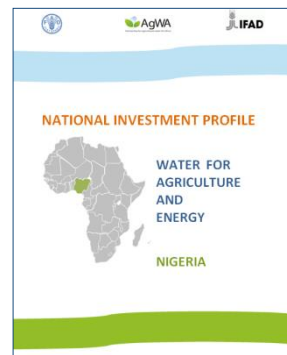
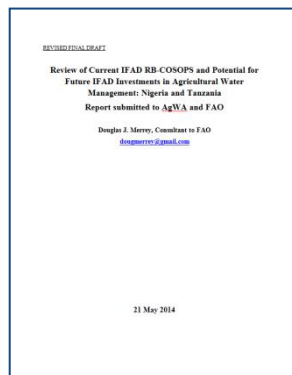
