Food production is vitally important to national economies, to meet development goals, to rural livelihoods and to human survival. The programme on Sustainable Consumption and Production (SCP) in Food and Agriculture is catalyzing partnerships between UN agencies, other international agencies, governments, industry, and civil society whose activities, together, can promote the essential transition to sustainability.

This programme promoting international cooperation on policies, investments, production and consumption patterns, is critical to meet food security, economic and environmental needs. Following introductory remarks by the Assistant Director General - AG of FAO on the rationale and expectations from the programme, the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) will present the outline of the programme, specifically looking at key activity areas already identified by the Task Force on SCP in Food and Agriculture. Panellists from Costa Rica, The Netherlands, Ghana, and Switzerland, will share their experiences and needs on implementing activities on SCP in the food sector, and also their expectations of this programme.
