The Side Event is made as a contribution to the follow up of the Rio+20 outcomes, to the Zero Hunger Challenge and to the 2015- Post Development Agenda.

The FAO-UNEP Sustainable Food Systems Programme, with the support of the Government of Switzerland, has been established in 2011, within the broader scope of sustainable consumption and production (SCP) with the aim to improve resource use efficiency and reduce the pollution intensity of food systems from production to consumption, while at the same time addressing issues of food and nutrition security. In 2012, at Rio+20 Conference, a 10Year Framework of Programmes on SCP was adopted.

While food production needs to increase to meet a growing global population, food systems rely on resources which are becoming ever more fragile and scarce. Therefore, all food systems worldwide have to face the same challenge to become more efficient and more sustainably productive in their use of these resources, at every stage, from primary production to transformation and consumption.

The discussions at this Side Event aim to raise a broader common understanding on the issues at stake related to improving the sustainability of the food systems.
