Since 2002, the BMEL provides FAO with seed money to develop projects with innovative concepts and strategies and to create a favorable environment for global food security and nutrition that can be adopted and disseminated by other donors.

So far, more than 100 projects in about 50 countries have been funded, focusing on Afghanistan, Sub-Saharan Africa and South-East Asia.
