Its actions are guided by medical ethics and the principles of neutrality and impartiality.

MSF was founded in Paris, France in 1971. Today, MSF is a worldwide movement of 24 associations, bound together as MSF International, based in Switzerland.

The International Board (IB) is the board of MSF International. It acts on behalf of and is accountable to the International General Assembly (IGA). As the highest associative governance body of MSF, the Assembly delegates duties to the Board, as defined in the Statutes of the association.

The highest authority of MSF International, the annual MSF International General Assembly (IGA) is made up of representatives of the 24 associations as well as of the individual membership, and the International President. The International President is elected by the IGA, and is currently Dr Joanne Liu.

For its interventions in more than 70 countries, MSF is organized around 5 operational centres, based respectively in Paris, Brussels, Amsterdam, Geneva and Barcelona.
