Overview

Under the Common Oceans ABNJ Program, also known as the *Global sustainable* fisheries management and biodiversity conservation in the Areas Beyond National Jurisdiction (ABNJ) Program, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) is organizing two side events along with partners and key speakers as part of the first Session of the Intergovernmental Conference on marine biological diversity of areas beyond national jurisdiction (BBNJ).

Deep-sea sponges and other biodiversity in the ABNJ: advances in research and information and implications for management

How are deep-sea sponges linked to resource management in the ABNJ and what are the implications for other biodiversity?

Having become a symbolic group for fisheries interactions and marine biodiversity, deep-sea sponge ground ecosystems contribute to key ecosystem services and hold an immense potential for biotechnological advances.

This session will present research highlights and key lessons from the SponGES project¹, which is a research and innovation project under the H2020 Blue Growth BG1 call aiming to develop an integrated ecosystem-based approach to preserve and sustainably use deep-sea sponge ecosystems of the North Atlantic.
