Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems (GIAHS) in Russia and rural tourism: initial contact

The Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems (GIAHS) represent not only stunning natural landscapes but also agricultural practices that create livelihoods in rural areas while combining biodiversity, resilient ecosystems, tradition, and innovation in a unique way.

Traditional agricultural systems feed billions of people around the world. They also sustain biodiversity and preserve genetic resources, help increase resilience to climate change, promote recognition, and strengthen rural livelihoods.

Such farming practices directly affect not only the food security of the territory they cover (SDG-2), but also many other Sustainable Development Goals. The palette of positive impacts of traditional activities comprises economic, social and environmental components.

Since 2005, FAO has designated 62 systems in 22 countries as agricultural heritage sites. Six of those are also included in the UNESCO World Heritage list. No sites have yet been designated in Russia.

The FAO Liaison Office with the Russian Federation, jointly with the National Association of Rural and Ecotourism, and the Department of Social-Economic Geography of Foreign Countries at the Lomonosov Moscow State University (MSU), is holding an international virtual conference dedicated to promoting GIAHS in the Russian Federation and strengthening rural and agritourism.
