Humanitarian consequences of climate change

Physical impacts of climate change

- Increased frequency and intensity of hydrometeorological hazards.
- Increased likelihood of drought and desertification.
- Melting of glaciers and ice caps.

Climate change exacerbates vulnerabilities

- Water scarcity.
- Food insecurity.
- Changes in the morbidity patterns of some diseases and decline in human health.
- Competition for scarcer resources with the potential for tensions/conflict and displacement.



Preparedness is the key:

Local communities, Governments and the international humanitarian community need to **bolster preparedness** in order to respond more effectively.



Good practices examples in DRM (preparedness component)

- Bangladesh, cyclone Sidr, Nov 2007.
- Southern Africa, floods.
- Emergency Rosters.
- Appeals for preparedness.
