Mountains and forests make headlines at the United Nations

Emphatic calls were made for mountains and forests to be prominently featured in the Post-2015 development agenda during a 5 February 2014 event at UN headquarters in New York as the 8th session of the UN's Open Working Group (OWG) on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) wrapped up its 'stocktaking' phase. Co-organized by the Mountain Partnership Secretariat (MPS), the Food and Agriculture Organization of the UN (FAO), the governments of Bhutan, Peru and Romania, the side-event showcased the social, economic and environmental contributions of mountains and forests. Panelists representing Bhutan, Peru and Romania outlined efforts in their respective nations to develop mountains and manage forests sustainably for the well-being and livelihoods of their citizens while moderator Thomas Gass, UN Assistant Secretary-General, noted the issues also need addressing at global level. Peru holds brainstorming session with 20 countries on including mountains in the Post-2015 development agenda

Diplomats from twenty countries convened at the Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations in New York, USA, on 6 February 2014 to discuss how to integrate mountains in the Post-2015 development agenda. Almost all of the countries in attendance belong to the Mountain Partnership and also serve on the UN General Assembly's Open Working Group tasked with drafting the sustainable development goals. In the midst of the Open Working Group's eighth and final 'stock-taking' session, the 'working lunch' conversation revolved around several documents prepared by the Mountain Partnership Secretariat (MPS), who, alongside the Food and Agriculture Organization of the UN (FAO), provided support for the lunch-hour meeting.

Ambassador Gustavo Meza-Cuadra of Peru highlighted the importance of having targets that can best be mainstreamed in the SDGs in an integrative manner. In this regard, he mentioned that the purpose of the working lunch was to start that thinking and, if at all possible, to come up with a number of targets that can be supported by the group during the next phase of the Open Working Group on SDGs.

Ambassador Csaba Körösi of Hungary sparked a discussion on universality, which led to the conclusion that although mountains cover 25 percent of the earth's land surface, they have universal importance because of the essential goods and services - such as water, biodiversity and energy - that they provide to all humanity. Science synthesis policy workshop

The <u>UN Educational Scientific Cultural Organization</u>'s International Hydrological Programme (IHP) hosted on 23-24 January 2014 in Paris, France, the last workshop of the series 'Climate Change Impacts in Major Mountainous Regions of the World'. The final workshop gathered policy makers, experts and stakeholders to review the recommendations from the regional workshops. They deliberated and refined key recommendations to governments for effective climate change policy in mountainous regions, such as: greater recognition of mountain specificities in policy at both local and regional levels; improved trans-boundary cooperation and enhanced science-policy platforms; better feedback mechanisms to monitor and evaluate policy impacts. This international congress seeks to reassess the importance of terraces/platforms as a mechanism for




