for the UN Food Systems Summit 2021**

The Mountain Partnership Secretariat and Theresa Tribaldos, Centre for Development and Environment, co-authored an info sheet as a contribution to the UN Food Systems Summit 2021. Worldwide, more than 80 percent of all food is produced by small-scale farmers. Small-scale farmers and pastoralists are predominant in mountain regions, where generally harsh weather and limiting topographical conditions prevail. Progress towards sustainable food systems cannot happen without improving the situation of small-scale mountain farmers worldwide. ... [Read More](#)
