



Philippine Top Exports by Major Commodity: 1980 & 2014






Value of Forest-based Products Imports and Exports: 2000-2014 (million USD, FOB)






MAJOR TRADING PARTNERS OF PHILIPPINES IN FOREST-BASED PRODUCTS: 2014 EXPORTS



MAJOR TRADING PARTNERS OF PHILIPPINES IN FOREST-BASED PRODUCTS: 2014 IMPORTS




Profile of imports and exports of forest-based products: 2014

- Top imported products
 - Plywood, veneered panels and similar laminated wood (China, Malaysia, Canada)
 - 2. Paper and Paperboard (Malaysia, Singapore, Vietnam)
 - Other wood sawn or chipped lengthwise, sliced or peeled, whether or not planed, sanded or end-jointed, of a thickness exceeding 6mm (China, Malaysia, Korea)
- Top exported products
 - Other builder's joinery and carpentry of wood, including cellular wood panels, assembled flooring panels, shingles and shakes (Japan)
 - Paper and Paperboard (Vietnam, Thailand, Indonesia)
 - 3. Windows and their frames (Japan)





Top Imported Forest-based Products: 2014 (value in '000 US\$)








Prospect from ASEAN Integration

ASEAN Integration


- 0-5% tariffs (2015) on forest-based products, especially for top imports (plywood & veneered panels, paper, and sawn wood products) and exports (other wood-based manufactures, paper, and furniture products)
- Implications
 - Lower prices for imported raw materials
 - Sustainability of supply in the face of increasing demand
 - Competitive advantage for exporters of high-value products






Value of Imports and Exports to ASEAN: 2007 & 2014






Exports to ASEAN: 2007 & 2014 (million US\$)







Profile of top imports from, and exports to ASEAN: 2014

IMPORTS	EXPORTS
Other plywood, veneered panels, and similar laminated wood	1. Other newsprint in rolls or sheets
2. Other uncoated paper and paperboard	2. Cigarette paper in rolls not exceeding 15cm
3. Other wood sawn and chipped lengthwise, sliced or peeled	3. Other recovered paper and paperboard
4. Particle board, oriented strand board and similar board	4. Sanitary towels, tampons, and similar articles
5. Other wood in the rough, whether or not stripped of bark or sapwood	5. Printed paper or paperboard labels



Way forward

- Continue relying on imported wood raw materials from other countries to supplement supply of local timber from timber plantations;
- In the long-term, achieving self-sufficiency in wood materials through our National Greening Program;
- Expand the sources of raw materials for nontimber forest products processing industries catering to the export market
