TERMES OF REFERENCE FOR THE JOINT PERMAMENT COMMITTEE (JPC) OF THE MEDITERRANEAN ANIMAL HEALTH CENTRE (MAHN / REMESA)

1. The JPC is REMESA's decision making body and operates according to the principles of GFTADs.

2. The JPC is composed by:

- The CVOs of the participant countries or their formally nominated representatives;
- A representative of FAO;
- A representative of OIE;
- Permanent observers: UMA, EC,...
- Other observers according to the JPC's agenda;
- The JPC composition may be amended by decision of the JPC during its regular meetings.

3. Strategic Role:

- The JPC defines the general objectives of REMESA and determines the thematic priorities;
- It validates the annual REMESA Action Plan, and eventually its pluri-annual Action Plan;
- It evaluates the general impact of the ongoing activities and therefore revises priorities and action plans;
- It settles the eventual disagreements concerning the implementation of activities.

4. Technical Role:

- The JPC establishes the technical working groups;
- It validates the Action Plans of the working groups;
- It validates the protocols for the implementation of activities;
- It assesses and validates the results on the basis of, at least, every six months reports submitted by the RAHC-NA in its role of Regional Coordination Unit (RCU).

5. Meetings

- The JPC meets at least once a year and if needed when requested by the RCU.
- The venue of the JPC meetings will be proposed by the RCU's, taking into account the regional balance between the REMESA participating countries;
- The minutes of the JPC meetings will be prepared and transmitted to the participants by the RCU;
- The decisions will be taken by the participating countries, in consultation with FAO and OIE.

6. Presidency

- The JPC is jointly presided, for a one year period, by two CVOs, each coming from one of the two shores of the Mediterranean. This presidency will follow the principle of rotation between countries.
- The RCU ensures the secretariat of the JPC.

7. Fund raising

The JPC ensures the active lobbying for the mobilisation of financial resources from donors.
