## Web sites

**Regional Aquaculture Information System (RAIS)** -- this new site, created by the FAO Fisheries and Aquaculture Department under the *aegis* of the Regional Commission for Fisheries (RECOFI), aims to facilitate the exchange of aquaculture information in the Gulf area among regional experts and stakeholders and to promote and develop a sustainable aquaculture industry.

EAF-Nansen -- promoting the Ecosystem Approach to Fisheries (EAF) in developing countries, the EAF-Nansen site highlights a five-year project to strengthen regional and country efforts to reduce poverty and create favorable conditions for food security through development of sustainable fisheries management regimes -- specifically by applying the EAF principles. The initial focus is on Sub-Saharan Africa. The EAF-Nansen project is executed by FAO in close collaboration with the Institute of Marine Research (IMR) of Bergen, Norway and funded by the Norwegian Agency for

Development Cooperation (Norad).

**Safety for fishermen** -- Fishing at sea is probably the most dangerous occupation in the world. This gateway provides information and material related to safety for fishermen. The site is hosted by FAO and managed by a selected group of experts contributing information and material on safety at sea in the fisheries sector.
