Program

More than 100 abstracts have been submitted from representatives and/or studies from approximately 25 countries! Please find attached a preliminary program for the different technical sessions (Observe: Might be subject to change – order of presentations and exact time table will be completed by mid-March). Please also see our presentation of plenary keynote speakers here, which will be updated further.

The program represents a wide range of multidisciplinary as well as more specific themes. For instance there are special sessions on pike and Atlantic salmon management, as well as innovative sessions on how to improve the use of angler generated data with new media in recreational fisheries management. In some jurisdictions and among some segments of the public, recreational fisheries are declining, while in other they are increasing. The dynamics of these changes as well as inspiring talks on how to recruit more anglers is also included in the program. Overall it should be attractive for the whole sector of recreational fisheries and we look forward to a truly international event!
