MEMBERSHIP OF THE WFP EXECUTIVE BOARD

In accordance with Resolution 6/99 adopted by the 30th Session of the FAO Conference 1. on 13 November 1999, the Council is required to elect six members of the WFP Executive Board for a term of office of three years from among FAO Member Nations.

2. For purposes of election to the Board, FAO Member Nations are divided into five separate lists (A, B, C, D and E) as shown in Appendix A to this document.

The present composition of the WFP Executive Board is given overleaf, with the List (as 3. per Appendix A) to which each member belongs indicated in brackets.

4. Appendix B to this document reproduces a letter dated 11 December 2003 addressed to the Secretary-General of the Conference and Council by the Permanent Representatives of El Salvador, Nicaragua and Guatemala. The letter informs the Secretary-General inter alia that Nicaragua will renounce its List C seat on 31 December 2005 in favour of Guatemala.

Accordingly, the Council is invited to note the resignation of Nicaragua from the WFP 5. Executive Board on 31 December 2005 and to agree that the seat thus vacated be filled by Guatemala.

6. Appendix C to this document reproduces a letter dated 22 November 2004 addressed to the Assistant Secretary-General of the Conference and Council by the Permanent Representatives of Kuwait and Thailand. The letter informs the Assistant Secretary-General that Thailand will stand down from its List B seat on 31 December 2005 in favour of Kuwait.

Accordingly, the Council is invited to note the resignation of Thailand from the WFP 7. Executive Board on 31 December 2005 and to agree that the seat thus vacated be filled by Kuwait.

8. The Council will therefore be required to elect six members for a term of office expiring on 31 December 2008 to replace the ones whose terms end on 31 December 2005, i.e. Switzerland $(D)^1$; Indonesia $(B)^2$; Finland $(D)^3$; Libyan Arab Jamahiriya (A); Peru (C); and Slovakia (E). The rotating seat held by list B (Indonesia) for the term 2003-2005 will pass to List A for the term 2006-2008 (see footnote 2).

9. Outgoing members are eligible for re-election.

10. A nomination form is given in <u>Appendix D</u>. The deadline for submission of nominations to the Secretary-General of the Council is <u>12.00 hours on Monday 21 November 2005</u>. The election of the above six members will take place at the 130^{th} FAO Council (28 November 2005).

¹ Belgium resigned its seat on 31 December 2004 in favour of Switzerland for the remaining period (2005).

 $^{^2}$ This seat rotates between lists A, B and C as follows: List A (2000-2002), List B (2003-2005), List A (2006-2008) and List C (2009-2011).

³ Ireland resigned its seat on 31 December 2003 in favour of Finland for the remaining period (2004 and 2005).

⁴Nicaragua has expressed its intention to stand down in favour of Guatemala on 31 December 2005.

⁵ Greece resigned its seat on 31 December 2003 in favour of France for the remaining period (2005 and 2006).

⁶ Thailand has expressed its intention to stand down in favour of Kuwait for the remaining period (2006 and 2007).
