TIMING

If possible, replies should be provided by <u>30 June 2005</u>. They will be taken into account in further work and in related submissions to FAO Governing Bodies.

CONTENT

The questionnaire covers three broad issues:

I. THE STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK FOR FAO

Views are requested on the continued relevance of the three Global Goals of Member Nations contained in the Strategic Framework for FAO 2000-2015¹. The information received will provide overall guidance on the Organization's focus and priorities. It will also provide an important early contribution to the revision of the Strategic Framework, foreseen in 2006-2007. Further consultation on the Strategic Framework will take place at a later date.

II. THE ROLE OF FAO IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MILLENNIUM DEVELOPMENT GOALS

While the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) do not constitute a complete development agenda, they are widely accepted as a focus for action at national level. They have also been adopted within the UN system as a means for focusing and integrating efforts to help countries achieve time-
